Forty-eight unique works on paper from the portfolio

Forty-eight unique works on paper from the portfolio A Community of Printmakers are reviewed by drawing students from classes taught by Richard Finch and Cynthia Kukla. Printmaking alumni, students, faculty, colleagues, and former visiting artists donated works for the project.

2012 Contract Printing

Normal Editions Workshop (NEW) has completed two limited edition color lithographs for the Gordon Fidler project. Fidler received his BA and Masters in Business Education at Illinois State, and later came back and taught freshmen business education classes. He was also the president of the Illinois State Alumni Association, and recipient of the Bert Mercier Distinguished Alumni Award. This project was commissioned by his daughters, Marta Eynatten and Tammy Potts, and their families to honor his memory and to be available for gifts from the University. NEW's Director, Richard Finch, was selected to create the images for the project, which was

coordinated by Brian Beam, Executive Director of University Marketing and Communications. This project is unique to the Workshop in that it is the first time in the history of the Workshop that NEW has produced prints with Richard Finch as the artist for the project. Two versions of the three-color lithograph were created, one including two images of Gordon Fidler, honoring his dedication as an Illinois State student and faculty member, and the other focusing on the University campus in late summer as a symbol of Fidler's enthusiasm for the beginning of each new academic year at this institution of higher education.

NEW has numerous projects scheduled for next year. With partial support from a Fell Trust award, we have started a three-color, 22" x 30" lithograph with Chicago based artist lan Weaver for the *Figurative Portfolio*. Ian received his MFA from Washington University in St. Louis, and began the work with NEW while serving as a visiting artist in the School of Art in the spring of 2012. Ian was recently selected as one of the seven recipients of the "Artadia Awards 2012 Chicago." We are also continuing to work with Jim Mai and Bill O'Donnell on their multi-color lithographs for the *CVA Suite III*.

2013 Visiting Artist Greg Page

A Fell Trust grant award to NEW will be used to host printmaker Greg Page during the spring semester 2013. Page will be presenting a public lecture and collaborating on limited edition prints. Page is an associate professor at Cornell


University. He earned his MFA from the University of Madison, Wisconsin, and has been co-director of Olive Press, worked as an assistant printer at Landfall Press in Chicago, and as a printer at Vermillion Editions Limited, in Minneapolis, MN. Page has had numerous shows, including one at Kurukshetra University in Haryana, India, and his work is in many permanent collections including the Brooklyn Museum of Art, the Museum of Fine Art in Houston, TX, the Museum of Fine Arts in San Francisco, CA, and the Mint Museum in Charlotte, NC. NEW is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday - Thursday and visitors are welcome. While at NEW, be sure to review Page's in-progress work, which will be in the CVA 129 Display Area during his time here. Richard Finch's and gladly would he learn and gladly teach as part of the research grant in a consortium of university print workshops. The award holder of the project is Dr. Cheryl Kolak Dudek of Concordia University in Montreal. In addition to Brandon Gunn and Judy Garfin of Concordia University and Richard Finch and Veda Rives of Illinois State, Lynne Allen of Boston University and Mark Bovey of Nova Scotia College of Art and Design University are co-investigators for this grant from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada.

For Peace and Tranquility, Shekara digitally manipulated a high-resolution scan of her lithograph, Shanti to add color to the black and white lithograph. The appearance of collé, as though on an Asian paper, was added to Pozzatti's Hercules II. Finch's image came from some of the production files used in the multi-color lithograph with some digital manipulation. Veda Rives, Richard Finch, Lisa Lofgren, Katie Johnson, and Alyssa Tauber all worked on the digital derivatives. These images will soon be available as free downloads at the website publicpressink.com because the basic premise of the research is to explore the market for e-published images using music downloads as a model for today's consumer expectations.

Printmakers' Exhibition and Sale

The 28th Annual Printmakers' Exhibition and Sale will be held on Friday, December 7th from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM in the lithography studio, room 127 in the Center for the Visual Arts (CVA) building. All prints are original artworks by ISU students, faculty, staff, alumni, and visiting artists. CVA is located on the south side of campus on Beaufort Street. Hourly parking is available at the south University structure on University Street.

Five auction items are featured in the event. Stag with the Golden Horns by Rudy Pozzatti, is a 26 3/4" x 34 3/4" two color lithograph with bronze powder dusting. Minimum bid for this framed impression at the silent auction is \$450.00 (retail price of an unframed impression is \$900.000). Duality by Richard Finch is a 8" x 11" three-color lithograph. Minimum bid for this framed impression at the silent auction is \$115.00 (retail price of unframed impression is \$225.00). This year, three prints are designated for the Printmaking Student Travel Fund to support student participation in national conferences. 100% of the proceeds from these auctions and other selected impressions offered in the sale event will go to the Printmaking Student Travel Fund. Travel Fund auctions include: I Wish by Sarah Smelser, *Polarity* by Richard Finch, and Reaching by Morgan Price. I Wish is a 6" x 7" monotype. Minimum bid for this **framed impression** is \$250.00 (retail price of \$500.00, unframed). Polarity is a 5.5" x 7.5" two-color lithograph and stencil work. Minimum bid for this framed impression is \$115.00 (retail price \$225.00, unframed). Reaching is a 9" x 6" two-color etching and screen print. Minimum bid for this framed impression is \$95.00 (retail price \$195, unframed).

All proceeds from the event will be used to support the ISU printmaking program. Silent Auction winners will be announced at 5:00 PM on December 7th. Participants need not be present to win.

This past March, ISU sent four students to the 2012 Southern Graphics Council International Conference in New Orleans, Louisiana. NEW also took part in the conference, with Richard Finch, Veda Rives, and Meda Rives participating in a very successful Publishers' Fair, selling both *Marks from the Matrix* books, and catalogs of Rudy Pozzatti's *Twelve Labors of Hercules*. We also established contact with Limerick School of Art and Design, in the Republic of Ireland. With this School, we are planning to create an exchange portfolio during the Spring semester as part of ART 347 Advanced Printmaking.

New at NEW & Printmaking

New Lithography Stones: ISU acquired ninety lithography stones over the summer! Eric Bernett, a former student of Jim Butler's, saw the stones in surplus and alerted us of their existence. Veda and Meda Rives drove to the Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, and spent the day selecting the stones to bring back. The addition of these stones gives ISU over 200 stones in our litho library.

Along with the new stones, other new equipment has been added to the lithography studio, such as a large rotary paper cutter, and a new glass for the NuArc photo exposure unit. With the help of Morgan Price, the lithography studio has been reorganized, making for a more open and usable space.

Artist Book Show: Transpace Gallery is hosting a show from December 4th through December 8th of artists' books curated by Alyssa Tauber. Students from a number of disciplines, including printmaking, painting, photography, and graphic design, have all contributed books to the show, revealing the wide range of methods and aesthetics found in artists' books. Honoring James D. Butler at the Mid America Print Council Conference

ISU and NEW are pleased to report that ISU Distinguished Professor Emeritus James D. Butler was honored as the 2012 Outstanding Printmaker at the Mid America Print Council (MAPC) conference Pressing Prints/Pressing Palms: The Entrepreneurial Printmaker at Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau, from November 1-3, 2012. Jim taught lithography at ISU from 1976 to 2009. Butler gave an Artist's Talk on November 1st and had a solo exhibition of his work in the River Campus Art Gallery, where a reception for the ISU gathering was held with support from Dean James Major and Director of Development in the College of Fine Arts, Brian Gawor. Several ISU faculty and alumni were able to attend, including Director of the School of Art, Tony Crowley.

This fall, two portfolios were organized to honor Jim's achievements. Richard Finch and Sarah Smelser organized a tribute portfolio. This exchange portfolio is comprised of editions of twenty-five impressions, with a paper size of 11 x 14 inches. One portfolio was presented to Jim and one archived at NEW. Participants in the tribute portfolio include: Tonia Bonnell, Harold Boyd, Sean Caulfield, Rhea Edge, Bob Erickson, Richard Finch, Helen Gerritzen, Julia Goos Pense, Brandon Gunn, Melissa Haviland, Craig Martin, Greg Page, Mary Jane Parker, Teresa Parker, Rosanne Retz, Meda Rives, Veda Rives, Eric Rohnmann, Nick Satinover, Amy Schmierbach, Sarah Smelser, Phillip Turner and Erik Waterkotte. This portfolio was on display during the conference.

Veda Rives and NEW interns organized a gift portfolio for Jim, with a paper size of 8.5 x 11 inches. This portfolio was open to anyone who wished to honor Jim with a unique work on paper. Forty-eight participants responded. We surprised

Jim with the gift portfolio during the ISU gathering. Jim insisted on finding tables to display the entire portfolio for all to see and enjoyed reviewing each piece. The catalog, A Community of Printmakers, was published by NEW to commemorate this portfolio, and included artists' images, biographies, statements and reproductions of the art. NEW and Print Students take part in MAPC activities

NEW participated at MAPC in a very successful Publisher's Fair, where *Marks* from the Matrix books, Rudy Pozzatti: The Twelve Labors of Hercules catalogs, and A Community of Printmakers catalogs were sold in addition to a lithograph by James D. Butler.

Graduate students Sam Buchanan, Chris Hagen, and Alyssa Tauber participated in the Mid America Print Conference. There, they saw numerous panel discussions, demonstrations, and listened to keynote speakers such as Jim Butler, Jaune-Qick-to-See Smith, and Jay Ryan. They also were able to meet ISU alumni, meet up with old friends, and make new ones. Alyssa and Chris also participated in the open portfolio, and received good feedback on their work. Alyssa, Chris, and Sam thank the Friends of the Arts for their support by selecting their application to the Friends of the Arts Academic Support Grants. This is a competitive grant which is open to both

graduates and undergraduates, and can be used for individual or group projects.

Recent Exhibitions

NEW is pleased to announce that Rudy Pozzatti's show, A Life in Print, at the University of Louisville Hite Art Institute in Louisville, Kentucky, attracted a large audience for the gallery. The show had four facets, including a collection of Pozzatti's lithographs and etchings, The Twelve Labors of Hercules lithographs (which were printed a NEW), a show of woodcuts made by Pozzatti and his University of Louisville colleague, Distinguished Professor Emeritus Henry Chodkowsky, and a collection of work made by former students, whom Pozzatti taught over the years. Together, these shows drew in about 2,300 visitors to the gallery between January 12 and February 19, 2012. After showing at Louisville, The Twelve Labors of Hercules went to the Quincy Art Center, in Quincy, Illinois, from May 11-July 15, 2012. The gallery had 265 visitors, with a high percentage of youth attending the exhibition. We are pleased to have been a part of The Labors of Hercules prints, and are glad to hear that the work received a "really super response" from the viewers. Congratulations, Rudy!
