

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S COLUMN

Another fraternity year (our eighth) is drawing to a close. In many ways it has been a highly successful year; the various individual Chapters have carried on diversified and active programs: Editor Bush has put out three fine issues of The Alphabet; Rho and Sigma Chapters were installed; and, as we go to press, plans are underway for the installation, in May, of Chapters at Northern Illinois University (DeKalb), and Shepherd College (Shepherdstown, West Virginia). But in other ways this has been a disappointing year; the two major projects which we launched so enthusiastically at the 1957 Convention have both been "flops": because of the inauguration of "National Library Week," our proposed "Be a Librarian Week," scheduled for mid-March, was so completely over-shadowed that it had to be cancelled; the Book Fairs that were to have been held by all the Chapters in March were not heldalthough a few Chapters expect to have fairs this summer.

But we cannot allow ourselves to be discouraged by our failures; an organization with eighteen Chapters and hundreds of alumni members is of great potential significance in the library world, and we must continue to seek for ways in which we can make our influence felt on the national level-perhaps, for one thing, we might try giving a National citation award each year to the individual who has done most to promote recruiting. But we must not abandon the Book Fairs-they are a most appropriate activity for our Fraternity; they will provide excellent publicity; and they can be excellent sources of revenue. And next March we will try to combine our "week" with National Library Week: I am in correspondence with the Chairman of NLW, and he seems very much interested.

The printing of the National Constitution, in booklet form, is in process at Terre Haute; we hope that copies will be ready for distribution soon.

The order for the new type membership certificate has been approved by the Executive Council, and has now been placed with Balfour. These certificates will be supplied to all active members and to all alumni.

Have you all seen the fine write-up that we received in the 1957 edition of Baird's Manual of American College Fraternities (pp. 516-17)? We are listed in the World Almanac also.

The 1959 National Convention will be held on April 24-25, at Illinois State Normal University, Normal, Illinois, with Mu serving at Host Chapter.

As we go to press, May 18 has been set for the installation date for Tau Chapter, Northern Illinois University, DeKalb, Illinois.


