

Greetings to all members of Alpha Beta Alpha as we move into our ninth college year. Last spring our membership reached the new high of 1,369; and there is every reason to believe that the phenomenal growth will accelerate rather than level off-Upsilon was installed at Shepherd College on November 1 (making West Virginia our first three-Chapter State!) and additional schools which have expressed an interest in having Chapters include Trenton State College, Trenton, N. 
