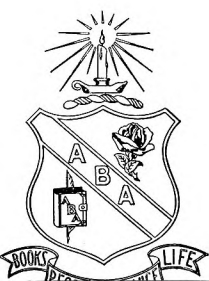

NEWS OF THE CHAPTERS

Alpha Chapter

A pre-school executive officers meeting was held to plan rush activities for the fall semester.

The Conference Tea was held in the college gymnasium and was greatly enriched by the displays of nearly forty book publishers. The conference dinner was enhanced by a vigorous and entertaining speech by Dr. Rowland M. Myers on the "Romance of Words."

Saturday's schedule of events began with a special meeting for the student library assistants. "How a Book is Made" was the subject of Joanna Foster Dougherty, author and illustrator of "Pages, Pictures and Print." The vice-president of the Encyclopedia Americana, Theodore Waller, continued in a similar train of thought with a discussion on the "Future of Publishing."

The conference was then brought to an end by the luncheon and a talk by Dr. Nancy Larrick, teacher, lecturer, editor, and author. She spoke on the "School Librarian and the Teacher."

"PROFESSIONAL LIBRARIAN" RESOLUTION

At its National Convention in 1961, Alpha Beta Alpha adopted as one of its major projects the promotion of the use of the term "professional" with reference to a person who has an undergraduate college degree, with a minimum of 18 semester hours of library science—however, there must be established and maintained a rigid distinction between the "professional" and "graduate professional" library science degrees. (N.B.—Inasmuch as a person having an undergraduate degree with 18 semester hours of Education courses is referred to as a "professional teacher," there is no logical reason why a person with similar qualifications in library science should not be referred to as a "professional librarian.")

(In his address at the 1961 Convention, "Reach for the Stars," Dr. Eugene P. Watson, former Executive Secretary of Alpha Beta Alpha, presented this statement about professional recognition. Dr. Watson requested that we not publish the text of his address in the **Alpha-bet**, in order that he might publish it where it would bring more recognition to the resolution and to Alpha Beta Alpha.)

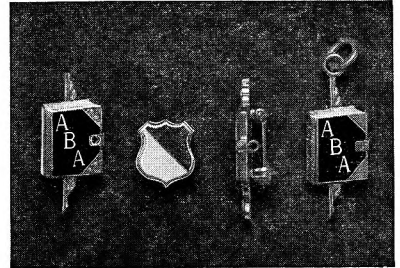
