

COMMENTS

In late October our National Executive Secretary, Miss Elliott, wrote and asked me if I would serve another year as National President, so I am back with you serving in that capacity again this year. I have been somewhat slow in getting many things started this year because I was off campus for eight weeks doing my student teaching. I pray that I can accomplish much this semester as your president.

In my comments in the last issue of The Alphabet, I said that as I dream of the future, I see a chapter of Alpha Beta Alpha in every school in the United States that offers library science on the undergraduate level-and instead of ABA being a national organization, I see it as an international organization or even as an interplanetary organization. However, before this can happen-even before Alpha Beta Alpha can become a strong national organization, we must draw closer together into one body instead of a group of separate bodies. We can do this by getting busy and living up to our goals and purposes - 1, to further the professional knowledge of its members, 2. to promote fellowship, and 3. to serve as a recruiting agency for librarians. A DISGUSTED STUDENT TEACHER REPORTS ON: THE DAY IN THE LIFE OF A LIBRARIAN

ANONONYMOUS GAMMA CHAPTER

Being a librarian is a bore. My first day in a library during my student teaching was the biggest let-down. I have always been led to believe that this was the best profession there was, but I'm beginning to wonder how professional it really is

When I arrived at the library, I started to look around. I scanned the shelves and started pulling the books to the front of the shelves. It makes me very nervous

to see books pushed back against a wall. By the time I finished, Miss Librarian had arrived (ten minutes after the children did). While she went to comb her hair, I sat down and waited patiently to get my orders for the day. Next she went to the teachers' lounge and brought back two cups of coffee. After a lengthy coffee break, we went through the book cards and found that several children had put down the library as their room, and some had put down the wrong names. Since the duplicate cards of books aren't written out, we even found blank cards with unknown names of children. As I tried to track these unknown children, I got several frank remarks and odd looks from teachers. By this time it was time for a coffee break.

After the break, we entertained a second grade class. These were my second graders. They filed into the library and sat on the floor. Miss Librarian then started to tell a story but was stopped immediately. "We heard that story! The teacher told us that story last week." They then pointed their finger at me. I felt like I could have crawled into the file cabinet. Miss Librarian was very upset with me because she had nothing else to tell them. Completely rattled, she dismissed them to select their books. While she scrambled for a magazine with a story to tell, one girl came up to me and asked where she could get the book numbered 1936. After some questioning, I found she wanted the book Blaze and had given me the copyright. The kids had a ball while attempting to pick out their books. They were shuffling around the library's carpet and found that if they touched anyone, that person would jump. All of a sudden all twenty-nine of them were shuffling and jumping around the library. By this time, Miss Librarian had found a story. When her attention got back to the class, she started stouting "Stop, Stop or you will go back to your room and loose your library privileges!" The threat didn't work. She was on the verge of getting the principal, when they all collapsed on the floor and began reading their books. She convinced them to stop reading and give her their attention. When she started to read this time, she found out that this story was continuous and it would be at least six weeks before she could finish it. She started it anyway. The story was about scones or, as she called them, rocks that you find by the seashore; but she couldn't explain why the children ate them. But with some quick thinking, she made it through the story

By now, it was time for recess and for coffee. Miss Librarian shot out of the library before I knew what was going on. She almost knocked the first graders over to get across the hall. While in the

lounge, she paused to flirt with some student teachers. Twenty minutes and three cups of coffee later, she returned and immediately ran to the washroom before the kindergarteners invaded.

The kindergarteners were just coming in when Miss Librarian got back. After they were seated, Miss Librarian asked "What is a library?" One brave young man raised his hand and said "Quiet!" This threw her for a while. After some discussion and a story, the kindergarteners picked up their books and marched out.

By now it was time for lunch. One hour and thirty minutes later we returned. She then started one of her very professional duties. I watched without daring to breathe as she started to open her mail. She only got halfway through, though, because she had to have a coke, so off we flew to the lounge. Twenty minutes or two cokes later, whichever is longer, we returned.

Having mastered the duty of opening mail, I picked up a magazine to browse. To my shock I found none of the magazines processed in any way. The order was the scrabble system or "put it on the shelf just the way it comes in"! so I found Instructor, Boy's Life, Highlights, and Plays stacked on top of each other. Without any word from headquarters, I started sorting, stacking, arranging and dusting shelves of magazines.

By the time I had finished she had had two coffee breaks and was now refereeing the Library Club. The club officers had been chosen, and Miss Librarian was standing in the middle of the floor posing as if she were a model for Vogue. She was pointing her finger at different tables as she proceeded to delegate duties. Since the teachers do their own carding before returning books to the library, the club was ordered to shelve books, straighten shelves, and file catalog cards, Of course they all knew these skills; they said so when asked. So on the sound of the whistle they scattered to all corners of the library to do their duties, while Miss Librarian struck another pose. When the duties were, finished, the students ran back to their seats, said their good-byes, and flew out the door because the buses had arrived to take them home. At this signal the librarian threw on her coat and raced the children out the door, knocking everyone down that got in her way. She was in a hurry because she had a dental appointment and she couldn't be late. Later I found out that she didn't go to the dentist at all but, she had gone to a local cocktail lounge.

I now must agree with and share the principal's philosophy. "The Librarian has the easiest job in the school."
