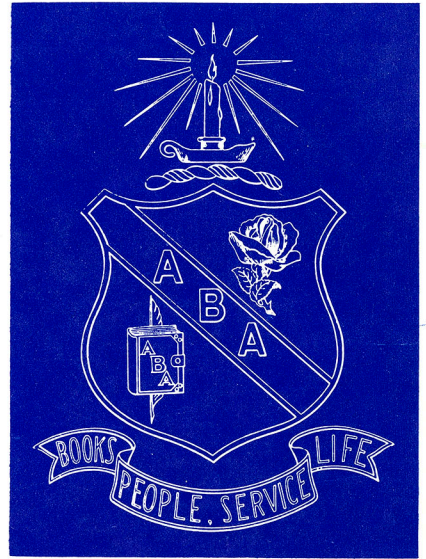

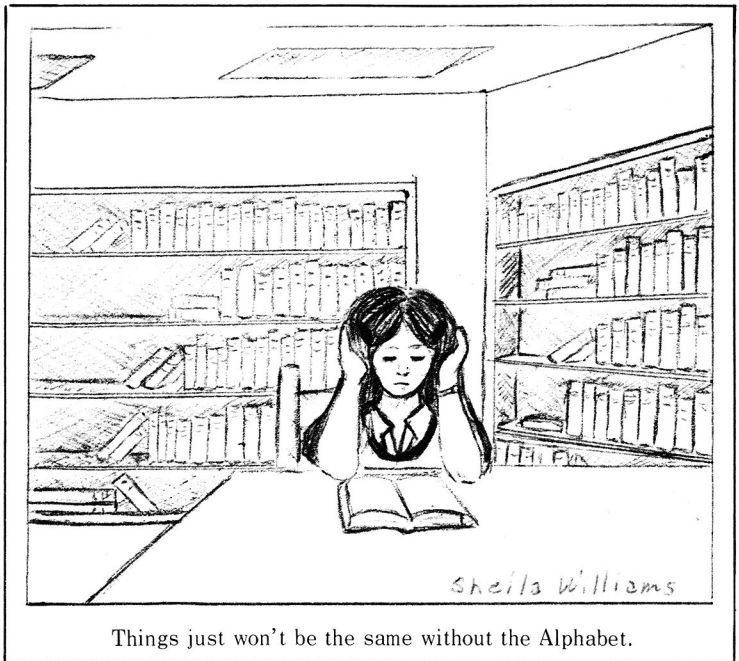

NATIONAL ORGANIZATION

Epsilon members began the Spring semester with a rush party for prospective pledges. Two librarians from local elementary school spoke to the group on school librarianship. Afterwards, refreshments were served. At the next meeting, five pledges were initiated. For the February meeting, Mr. Gerald Miller, Regional Librarian, discussed state and regional library programs. Plans are now being made to organize a campus-wide book fair to be held in the Student Union Building. Our annual Spring Banquet is scheduled for March 18, which will be the highlight of the spring semester.

Two years ago this April, Epsilon Chapter hosted the National Convention of Alpha Beta Alpha on the campus of Murray State University. Many things were discussed at this convention concerning individual chapters, chapter district, convention improvements, pledging, constitutional revision, and national officers. At the second general session of the 1972 convention chapter members were nominated for the offices of National President and National Vice-President. As of March 1974 Alpha Beta Alpha has not yet elected national officers, and has not yet set up a 1974 national convention. Who are

our National Officers? Where are our National Officers? The question now is do the chapters of Alpha Beta Alpha need or even want national officers and a national convention?

Alpha Gamma Chapter for one does not only want national officers but feels that the existence of these officers is vitally necessary to the organization and to the whole future of Alpha Beta Alpha. We have found in editing the ALPHABET for the past two years that the Fraternity is very unorganized and only through the ALPHABET and the Executive Secretary is there any communication between chapters. We have done our best in keeping the chapters aware of each other's projects and we are very

thankful to those chapters who have helped us by sending in their chapter news and any other bits of information that they feel may be interesting to the Fraternity. But the organization and unification of the Fraternity should not stop with the newspaper or Miss Elliott, our National Secretary. It should continue or perhaps begin with a competent and interested organizing body - National Officers.

The Alpha Beta Alpha constitution states that the officers of this Fraternity will be President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Executive Secretary, and one Councilman from each district. The constitution also gives the duties of each officer and how these officers are to be elected. Article X, Section 1 states that:

“there shall be biennial national Conventions of the membership of the Fraternity at such times and places as shall be determined by the Executive Council. The Conventions shall be primarily professional in nature. But free discussions of the Fraternity's policies may be held; and necessary business may be transacted.”

Since Alpha Beta Alpha does not have national officers it also has no national convention at which those things mentioned above can be carried out. What is the purpose or use of a national constitution if it is not followed?

The girls, who were nominated at the 1972 convention, have graduated or will soon be graduating. They cared enough in 1972 to run for the offices, we must not have cared enough to elect them. It is now 1974, does anybody still care? It certainly doesn't seem as though we do.

Not too long ago a newsletter was sent from the ALPHABET Staff to the chapters concerning the election of national officers for 1974-75. The chapters were asked to vote on a method of election and then to vote for a chapter that they felt was worthy of the office. The chapter with the highest votes would then select, from

their members, the officers. These would serve as the Fraternity's national officers. The following tabulation shows the result.
