## Televised Library Lessons

This fall approximately 1400 freshmen have been receiving their introduction to Milner Library via closed circuit TV.

This new teaching technique will be the second wide-scale test of the University's \$30,000 campus hook-up.

#### MEMBERS OF ABA ACTIVE ON CAMPUS


ABA is proud to have on its membership roll a group of leaders in campus activities.
