CHANGES TAKING PLACE

In Milner Library

To serve her patrons better, ISU, in September, 1968, was connected into a growing interlibrary teletype network. The aim is to increase the speed by which books can be exchanged between ISU and othe libraries by interlibrary loan. This network extends across the country and links most major libraries with an almost instantaneous means of communications.

Changes, Cont'd.

The libraries in Illinois are presently connected into it are: University of Illinois, Southern Illinois University, Chicago Public Library, and Illinois State University.

As all ABA members are well aware, the library is now in the process of changing its classification system from Dewey to Library of Congress. This was started in November of 1966 when all new books were classified with a Library of Congress number. In September of 1968, the staff began changing the old books. They started with the biographies and are still in that phase. Currently, the work is being done by three full time and three student employees. This staff is headed by Miss Eleanor Matthews. The work will continue for at least four more years according to Miss Matthews.

In Alpha Beta Alpha

This year ABA has made a change in its pledging program. In past years, pledges had to pass a pledge test and attend all meetings of ABA. This year pledges must earn points. These points are earned by being on committees, attending certain ABA events, and collecting the names of various ABA members. The pledges elected officers at their first pledge meeting. The President, Mary Harms, is in charge of keeping the total number of points each pledge has received. The secretary, Violette Brooks, takes the minutes at each pledge meeting. The two ABA members in charge of the pledges are Linda Hoskins and Phil Ringenberg.

A committee to revise the Mu Chapter constitution was organized in November. Copies of the revision were handed out at the December meeting. Changes were made that would help solve future problems of an expanding organization. The Chapter will vote on the constitutional changes at the February meeting.
