SENATE MEETING  
May 1, 1956

The meeting was called to order by Dean Larsen with all members present except Mrs. Hall, Mr. Hiatt, Mrs. Malmberg, Mr. L. W. Miller, and Mr. Wade.

The Dean called attention to materials which had been distributed preparatory to the scheduling of classes for the summer session and the first semester of next year. He referred to some helpful changes in connection with materials. He also called attention to the fact that more classes are being scheduled on Saturday than has been true in the past. Tallies of sections should be reported to Dean Larsen's office not later than Saturday, June 2. The mimeographed material should be considered as the official copy and any questions concerning corrections should be discussed with the Dean's office.

Copies of departmental budgets were distributed as approved here on the campus. These must be approved by the Teachers College Board and will probably not be considered before the July Board meeting.

Forms for the biennium of July, 1957-1959 will be made available by the Business Office probably by the middle of next week. Materials for the next biennium should be turned in to the Business Office not later than June 8, 1956.

Dean Larsen reported on the number of master's degrees given by the University through August 1955. A total of 478 degrees have been granted. Of these 225 were granted in the Secondary School and Community College areas, with first teaching fields in the various departments offering graduate work; 169, in the field of School Administration, including both elementary and secondary school levels; 23, in Elementary Education; 23, in Special Education; 22, in the field of Guidance and Personnel; and 16 in the field of Supervision.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 p. m. The next regularly scheduled meeting of the University Senate will be held on Tuesday, October 2, 1956.
