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Milner Library has started a paperback checkout of which some of you may not be aware. Here is the procedure for checking them out:

- 1. Selection is made from the display racks in the quadrangle of the lobby. Two books may be checked out for a two week period.
- 2. Take your selections to the library attendant at the near-by Exit Control Point.
- 3. The student fills out the single line on the charge-out sheet (last name, social security, and title.)

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- 4. Attendant will stamp the due date(2 weeks later) on the charge-out sheet and also on the title page of the book(which is already stamped ISU-Library due in two weeks.) There are no other cards, pockets, or slips.
- 5. Books are to be returned to the same counter. Attendant will cross out the line on the charge-out sheet for that book and will cross out the date on the title page.
