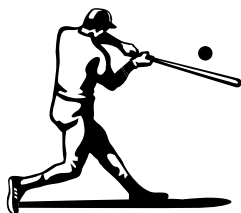

CRIME PREVENTION AND SAFETY AT WORK

Crime doesn't leave the campus every May with the students. Problems such as fires, thefts, burglaries, and criminal damage can occur year round. The following is a list of common-sense prevention skills that can make the workday safer for everyone and help reduce crime on campus.

- Keep your purse, wallet, keys, or other valuables with you at all times or locked in a drawer or closet. Mark your initials and an ID number (not SSN) on your personal property.
- Check the identity of any strangers who are in your office. If anyone makes you uncomfortable, call the police department immediately.
- Don't stay late if you'll be alone in the office. Create a buddy system for walking to parking lots or public transportation after hours. Let someone know if you will be coming in late or working late.
- Report any broken or flickering lights, dimly lit corridors, broken windows, and doors that don't lock properly to Facilities Management for repairs.
- If you notice signs of potential violence in a fellow employee, report this to the appropriate person. Immediately report any incidents of sexual harassment.
- Know the university's emergency plan, (www.ehs.ilstu.edu/downloads/EmergencyManagementPlan.pdf)
- Keep your own emergency supplies (flashlight, walking shoes, water bottle, nonperishable food, etc.) in a desk drawer.
- Support each other. Determine how you will help each other in the event that public transportation is down or thoroughfares are impassable. Are there employees who could temporarily house, transport, or feed other employees?
- Know the exit routes and evacuation plans in your building. Know at least two exit routes from each room, if possible. Be able to escape in the dark by knowing how many desks or cubicles are between your workstation and two of the nearest exits.
- Know the location of fire extinguishers and medical kits.
- Make sure there is a designated meeting location and that every employee knows what it is.
- Make special emergency plans for co-workers who are disabled or may require assistance during an emergency.
- Never lock fire exits or block doorways, halls, or stairways. However, keep fire doors closed to slow the spread of smoke and fire.
- Have a printed list of important phone numbers (e.g., your spouse's number at work, your children's school numbers) at your desk. Do not rely on electronic lists, such as direct-dial phone numbers and computer organizers.

RECIPE REVEAL

BEST LEMONADE EVER: from www.allrecipes.com.

- 1 ¾ cups white sugar
- 8 cups water
- 1 ½ cups lemon juice

In a small saucepan, combine sugar and 1 cup water. Bring to boil and stir to dissolve sugar. Allow to cool to room temperature, then cover and refrigerate until chilled.



Remove seeds from lemon juice, but leave pulp. In pitcher, stir together chilled syrup, lemon juice and remaining 7 cups water.

CUCUMBER SLICES WITH DILL: from www.allrecipes.com.

- 4 large cucumbers, sliced
- 1 onion, thinly sliced
- 1 tablespoon dried dill weed
- 1 cup white sugar
- ½ cup white vinegar
- ½ cup water
- 1 teaspoon salt (optional)

In a large serving bowl, combine cucumbers, onions and dill. In a medium size bowl combine sugar, vinegar, water and salt; stir until the sugar dissolves. Pour the liquid mixture over the cucumber mixture. Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving (the longer this dish marinates the tastier it is!).

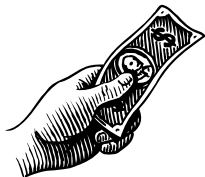
