News and Accomplishments (in alphabetical order):

The ISU orchestras and **Dr. Glenn Block** had a busy September, performing its first full concert of the season on Sunday, September 25 with music by Wagner, Koussevitzky, K. Aduonum, and Schumann. The concert featured ISU double bass professor **Dr. Benjamin De Kock** and guest African composer Khasi Aduonum. In October, the ISU Philharmonia Strings will perform its debut concert on October 14. The ISU Symphony will go on a Chicago-land tour October 19-20, where they will perform at six high schools, visit the Art Institute, and attend a Chicago Symphony concert. The ISU Symphony is also preparing for the first orchestra/choral collaboration since before the pandemic with a performance on October 30 of the Haydn "Mass in Time of War" with the ISU Concert Choir (**Mark Grizzard**, director), ISU Civic Choir (**John Koch**, director), and faculty soloists **Michelle Vought** (soprano), **Elizabeth Thompson** (mezzo-soprano), **Justin Vickers** (tenor), and **John Koch** (baritone).

He is pleased to be serving as the Master Teacher for the Dolce class in String Project this year, which has nearly 40 beginners!
