Illinois State University announced the launch of a new application called Bird Watch, which gives security tips and updates on mobile devices.



The Bird Watch mobile app provides students, faculty, staff, and the community with security information about Illinois State. Users can access a number of

important campus resources on topics that include emergency management, crime statistics, and crime prevention. The app is part of a larger campus-wide crime prevention program, based on the success of the national Neighborhood Watch Program.

Bird Watch is now available to download for Android and Apple devices at Google Play and iTunes Stores. Campus Sentinel, Inc. developed the Bird Watch app for Illinois State University, and is a company specializing in mobile applications for higher education safety and security.
