

Dear Professor Sutherland:

The faculty of the Department of Speech Pathology and Audiology recommends that the University Speech and Hearing Clinic be renamed the Eckelmann-Taylor Speech and Hearing Clinic to honor the contributions made by Dr. Dorathy Eckelmann, Emeritus Professor of Speech, and the late Dr. Glenn Taylor, Professor of Speech. The Department proposes to install an appropriate plaque in Fairchild Hall identifying the area now being used for the Clinic. We concur in this recommendation.

According to the regulations of the Board of Regents, "the President, after consultation with members of the university community, shall make a confidential report to the members of the Board of the name being proposed. . ." In view of the difficulty of keeping the matter confidential while meeting the spirit of the regulation concerning consultation, we would like this matter to be considered informally at the next meeting of the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate. If there are no objections by the Executive Committee, we shall transmit the recommendation to the Board of Regents.
