Chairperson Len Schmaltz called the meeting of the Academic Senate to order at 7:10 p.m. in the Circus Room of the Bone Student Center.

XVII-127 Mr. Wagner moved to approve the Minutes of April 16, 1986 (Second, Lorber).
Motion carried on a voice vote.

Approval of Internal Committee Assignments

XVII-128 Ms. Newman moved to approve the slate of Internal Committee Assignments (Second, K. Strand). Motion carried on a voice vote. List appended to these minutes.

Approval of 1986 Academic Senate Meeting Calendar

XVII-129 Mr. Johnston moved approval of the 198 Academic Senate Meeting Calendar (Second, Wood). Motion carried on a voice vote.

Change in Illinois State University Constitution (2.27.86.1 & 2)

XVII-129 Mr. Semlow moved approval of the proposed change in the ISU Constitution (Second, Wagner).

Article V, Section 1, Part A:

"The membership of the Academic Senate shall consist of 27 elected faculty members, 17 elected student members, the President of the University, the Vice President and Provost, the Vice President and Dean of Student Affairs, the Vice President for Business and Finance, the President of the Student Body, and the Student Regent."

Mr. Semlow explained that this amendment would place the Student Regent on the Academic Senate as an ex-officio, voting member. It takes one of the undergraduate elected seats away from students. The number of members would change from 18 to 17, and the phrase "and the Student Regent" was added to the end of the paragraph.

Ms. Roof asked what would happen if the Student Regent were chosen from one of the already-elected senators. Mr. Semlow said that the vacant senate seat would then be filled.

Ms. Newby reiterated her question from the last meeting regarding the procedures by which the Student Regent is chosen. Would this create a problem, since the other student senators are elected.

Mr. Gamsky deferred to Mr. Ritter. Mr. Ritter stated that each college council nominates two persons for a selection committee. The S.B.B.D. acts on these nominations, electing one member from each college to serve on the selection committee. This committee screens applications, conducts interviews, and makes a selection for student regent.

Mr. Semlow said there was no formal change in this procedure.

Mr. Gamsky reminded senators that the Student Regent position was appointed rather than elected.

Mr. Shulman stated that he had signed the petition for this change in the constitution. He was concerned about this amendment for two reasons:

- 1) Since there are approximately 20,000 students at this university, there should be more students involved in the Academic Senate; and
- 2) He thought that it would be a big burden to be a full-time student, academic senator, and Student Regent all at once. For these reasons, he would probably vote against this amendment.

Ms. Getsi did not think a typical student would want to do this sort of thing. The whole idea would be to have an atypical student in this type of position.

Mr. Borg asked if one of the primary reasons for having the Student Regent on the Senate was for information, why couldn't the Student Regent meet with the Student Caucus.

Mr. Johnston said it would not be that much of a burden on a student. He had shared an office with Dan Prachar and observed him last year. Mr. Ritter was SBBD President, on the Senate and numerous committees.

Mr. Delong asked Mr. Semlow what sort of implementation he was considering, since we have a standing Student Regent and also a full slate of student senators at the present time. If this were to be adopted, when would it be implemented and what would be the implementation procedures.

Mr. Semlow said it would take effect at the next Academic Senate election, which would be a year from the last election (February 1987). The Student Regent would carry out a short term and the new Student Regent would take over in June or July of 1987.

Mr. Wagner asked what the benefits of this amendment were. Mr. Semlow answered that the benefits would be twofold. One would be that the Student Regent would bring valuable information to the Senate; the second would be that it would help the Student Regent understand a lot of issues that come up before the Board of Regents.

Mr. Wagner asked if this would be just as effective as having the Student Regent attend the Student Caucus. Mr. Semlow answered no. be informative to students, but faculty also needed to hear his information.

Mr. Schira stated that just having the Student Regent serve on the Student Caucus would not let the Regent get to know the Academic Senate and its concerns.

Mr. Sessions asked if the Student Regent was also a member of ISU's The answer was "no". He sits on the Board of Regents. delegation to JUAC.

Mr. Petrossian asked about the election procedure. Would the Student Regent be a member of the Senate just by being appointed as Regent? Would he/she be elected as a Senator? It was pointed out to him by the Chair that there were other senators that were not "elected".

Mr. Goldstein was concerned about losing an elected seat on the Senate, but if the students wanted this, he would support it.

(XVII-129) Roll call vote on ISU constitutional amendment passed 42 yes; 2 no; and one abstention.
