About the Artist



Dr. Geoffrey Duce is Assistant Professor of Piano at Illinois State University. He has performed in New York's Carnegie Hall, Berlin's Philharmonie and Konzerthaus, London's Wigmore Hall, Manchester's Bridgewater Hall and Edinburgh's Queen's Hall, across Europe and in Japan, Hong Kong and Canada.

Dr. Duce's career has featured both solo and collaborative performances. As a concerto soloist he has appeared with the Sinfonie Orchester Berlin, the Chattanooga and Olympia Symphony Orchestras, the Edinburgh Philharmonic, the New York Sinfonietta, and the Dundee Symphony Orchestra, and as a chamber musician and accompanist he has recorded for BBC Radio 3 and performed at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. He won the Young Artists Award from Britain's National Federation of Music Societies, and was awarded the Prix de Piano at the American Conservatory in Fontainebleau, France.

Prior to his appointment at Illinois State University, Dr. Duce has served on the faculty at the Manhattan School of Music, Indiana University South Bend, and at the State University of New York at Westchester Community College.

Dr. Duce initially studied at the Royal Northern College of Music and Manchester University before receiving a DAAD scholarship to the Universität der Künste, Berlin. He received his doctorate from the Manhattan School of Music. His principal teachers have included Phillip Kawin, Ferenc Rados, Klaus Hellwig and Renna Kellaway.
