APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the May 16 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Legg and seconded by Mr. Harden.

BUILDING COMMITTEE

Elizabeth Russell, Chairman of the University Council reported that Mr. Perry Ragouzis, who was recently elected to the Building Committee plans to be on leave next year, and that a replacement needed to be elected. From the nominations made by the executive committee and those made from the floor, Mr. Donald Prince was elected on the first ballot.

LIBRARY ANNEX BUILDING COMMITTEE

The Chairman of the University Council announced that a representative of the University Council should be elected to serve as chairman of the subcommittee to plan the Library Building Annex. From the nominations made by the executive committee Miss Alice Ebel was elected on the first ballot.

RESOLUTION REGARDING THE EQUAL RIGHTS OF ALL STUDENTS

Dr. Dalluge presented a memorandum prepared by Eric Johnson which gave the background for the statement which the University Council approved in principal by a mail ballot on May 23. Mr. Johnson indicated that the Teachers College Board approved this statement at their meeting at DeKalb on June 18.

"The University affirms its position that the specific human worth and dignity of the individual should not be violated because of his race, creed, or national origin. To insure the welfare of the University community and to promote a proper environment for democratic education, the University will discourage and seek to eliminate discriminatory practices wherever found in any organization, housing, or similar activity under supervision or jurisdiction of the University."

A motion was made by Mr. Philpot and seconded by Mr. McCarthy that our minutes show that this statement was approved by the University Council before it was presented to the Teachers College Board, and that the Council was gratified to know that this statement was accepted by the Teachers College Board on June 18.

The Meeting adjourned at 12:40 p.m.
