Bands at Illinois State University

Illinois State University Marching Band: "The Big Red Marching Machine" has a long and proud history of performances for major events at home and across the Midwest. Each year, in addition to performing at all home football games and for over 4,000 high school band members at the State of Illinois Invitational High School Marching Band Championship, the "Pride of Illinois" travels to an away Illinois State football game and a televised Chicago Bears game. The "Big Red" is open to all Illinois State University students and is comprised of winds, percussion, color guard and danceline.

The Wind Symphony is a select group of the finest instrumentalists at Illinois State University, performing outstanding and representative works in all styles from classical to avant-garde. The Wind Symphony has performed at the prestigious American Bandmasters Association Convention and in the Spring of 1993 at the College Band Directors National Association Convention in Columbus, Ohio. Membership is by audition only and is open to all Illinois State University students.

The Symphonic Winds is a group of approximately 50 outstanding instrumentalists at Illinois State University, who perform representative works in all styles from classical to avant-garde. Membership is by audition only and is open to all Illinois State University students.

The Symphonic Band is comprised of approximately 75 outstanding wind and percussion players from across campus. It performs only quality band literature and concertizes both on and off campus. Membership is by audition only and is open to all Illinois State University students.

The University Band is comprised of primarily of music majors gaining experience on a secondary instrument. The ensemble also provides non music majors the opportunity to continue playing while devoting the major portion of their time to other academic disciplines. This organization rehearses once a week and presents one concert a term on campus. Membership is open to all Illinois State University students.

The Pep Band provides spirit and enthusiasm at all Illinois State men's and women's home basketball games, as well as various other events on campus and in the community. Members of this band have accompanied the Illinois State basketball teams to the NCAA and NIT tournaments. Membership is by audition only, and is open to all students who participate in another band during the academic year.

Chamber Winds is comprised of numerous quartets and quintets which are coached by members of the applied music faculty at Illinois State University. The collective ensembles perform a diverse repertoire and concertize both on and off campus. Membership is by audition only and is open to all Illinois State University students.

The Jazz Band is a select group of approximately twenty musicians who make up a "big band" with complete instrumentation. Emphasis is placed on the study of diverse jazz styles and literature, ensemble performance and improvisation. The band has been awarded outstanding performance honors at numerous festivals including the Notre Dame College Jazz Festival, the Elmhurst College Jazz Festival and the Kansas City College Jazz Festival.
