A native of Maryland, David Zerkel is a graduate of The Peabody Conservatory of Music and The University of Maryland. He has taught tuba and euphonium at the Virginia Commonwealth University and the American University. He has performed with the Richmond Symphony Orchestra, The United States Army Band and Orchestra of Washington, D.C., the New York City Opera Orchestra, the Joffrey Ballet Orchestra, the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, the National Symphony Orchestra and Brass Quintet, Washington Symphonic Brass and The United States Army Band Brass Quintet. His numerous solo appearances and travel throughout the United States, Canada, Europe and the Far East make him one of America's busiest tuba players.
