Frank Kowalsky, the Joseph A. White Professor of Clarinet, has performed as principal clarinetist with orchestras throughout the United States, including the Naples Philharmonic, Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra, and Northwood Orchestra. He has also been a member of the United States Marine Band, the Colorado Philharmonic, the Rochester Philharmonic, and Music at Gretna. Recent activities include a tour to England as guest soloist with the Florida State Winds and several nation-wide tours as a member of the Trio Con Brio. He serves as music director for the Tallahassee Ballet's annual production, Evening of Music and Dance, and appears regularly with the Seattle Chamber Music Festival. A member of the faculty at the Interlochen Arts Academy for ten years, he has been Professor of Clarinet at FSU since 1984. Dr. Kowalsky holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music, the Manhattan School of Music, and the Catholic University of America.

Seth Beckman, Assistant Dean for Academic Affairs and Director of Graduate Studies, joined the School of Music in 2002. He is responsible for the coordination, implementation, and administration of all graduate and undergraduate programs in the School of Music. Dr. Beckman enjoys an active career as administrator, pianist, and pedagogue. As soloist and collaborator, he performs frequently throughout the United States and Europe. He is also a published author, with articles on performing and pedagogy appearing in such journals as *American Music Teacher*. As an adjudicator, Dr. Beckman frequently assists in this capacity with competitions sponsored by local, regional, and national organizations. He is a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music, as administered by MTNA (Music Teacher's National Organization). He received the Doctor of Arts and Master of Music degrees from Ball State University, and received his bachelors degree from Saint John's University (MN). Dr. Beckman received additional, substantive training at the Aspen Music Festival and School. Prior to coming to Florida State University, Dr. Beckman served as Assistant Director of the School of Music at the University of Illinois (Urbana-Champaign). He has also served as Chairperson for the Department of Music at Bemidji State University (MN), and was a member of the keyboard faculties of Stephen F. Austin State University (TX) and Manchester College (IN).
