Since 1986, Associate Professor Georgia Hornbacker (BM/MM Indiana University) has taught violin, upper string pedagogy and methods, and coached chamber music at Millikin. She has been Associate Concertmaster of the Illinois Symphony Orchestra and Chamber Orchestra for the past 28 years, and has served as Associate Concertmaster of Opera Illinois. As violinist with the Kirkland Trio she has performed recitals in Taiwan at the National Taiwan University, on WILL radio's Second Sunday Concert Series, the Table Arts Chamber Series, and at Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago. She has played concertos with the Millikin-Decatur Symphony Orchestra, the Illinois Symphony Orchestra, the Illinois Chamber Orchestra, and the Illini Symphony at the University of Illinois. For six years, she has been a member of the faculty of ISYM, Illinois Summer Youth Music at UI Champaign-Urbana. Professor Hornbacker is a regular review for *American String Teacher*, the journal of the American String Teachers Association (ASTA) and was named Outstanding Studio Teacher for 2001 by Illinois' ASTA chapter.

Amy Flores, 'cellist, is currently Adjunct Assistant Professor of Music at Millikin University where she teaches 'cello, low string methods, and coaches chamber music in addition to her duties as 'cellist of the Kirkland Trio and principal 'cellist of the Millikin-Decatur Symphony Orchestra. Amy is an active freelance musician in Central Illinois and was recently appointed co-principal 'cellist of the Illinois Symphony Orchestra and Illinois Chamber Orchestra. She also performs with Sinfonia da Camera, the Champaign-Urbana Symphony, and the Prairie Ensemble. Prior to her move to Central Illinois Amy was a core 'cellist with the Naples Philharmonic and continues to play on an occasional basis. She has soloed with the Port Charlotte Symphony and in 2002 performed Dvorak's 'cello concerto with the MDSO and the Illini Symphony Orchestra at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. Amy is a faculty member at Blue Lake Fine Arts camp and was educated at the University of Akron and the Eastman School of Music.

Judith Mancinelli has been a member of the Millikin University piano faculty since 1980, and has served as pianist for the Kirkland Trio since its founding in 1987. In addition to being an active concert pianist, chamber musician and accompanist, she serves as violinist in the Millikin-Decatur Symphony Orchestra and in several string quartets. Mrs. Mancinelli made her debut at the age of thirteen, performing Haydn's Piano Concerto in D Major with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. She has received degrees from Maryville College and the University of Tulsa, where she subsequently taught piano and served as staff accompanist from 1971 to 1980.
