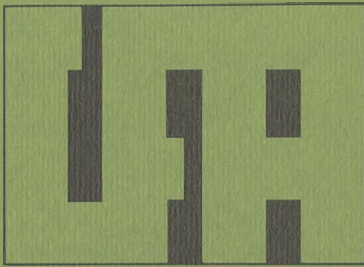

## **STUDENT RECITAL** **THE JOHN CAMPBELL QUARTET**

Glenn Morrison (trumpet) is a graduate of ISU, having been featured trumpet soloist with the ISU Jazz Ensemble for three years. (He was also co-captain of the 1971-72 ISU Hockey Redbirds.) His first "gig" was with the Salvation Army Band in Yorkville, Ontario, at the tender age of eight, doubling on trumpet and bass drum. His awards include Best Trumpet Soloist at the Kansas City Jazz Festival for two consecutive years, Honorable Mention at the Notre Dame Jazz Festival, and the coveted John Phillip Sousa High School Band Award.

John Campbell (piano) is a sophomore music major at ISU, where he studies percussion with Mr. Roger Faulmann. He is a member of the Concert and Mallet Percussion Ensembles, as well as Varsity Band. He has played bass with the ISU Jazz Ensemble for two years. His awards include Outstanding Musician at the Purdue Summer Jazz Workshop, his high school Band Award, and All-Star Musician on piano and vibes at the Oak Lawn Jazz Festival, where his groups have received Runner-up and First Place honors (with a perfect score). He was Best Bassist at the Kansas City Jazz Festival last year. He is currently compiling a filmography and a biography of the Three Stooges.

Rick Drexler (bass) is a sophomore music major at Illinois Wesleyan. He is active in choir, Orchestra (playing viola), and Jazz Band (playing piano). He has received awards at the Oak Lawn Festival (All-Star Bass), and his high school Orchestra Award. He has also served as accompanist to the Singing Y'ers. Rick feels that his ultimate achievement and life-long dream will eventually be the sublimation of the apotheosis of the lobster.

Clay Hulet (drums) is a sophomore at ISU, having transferred from Florida State University in Tallahassee. He has played drums for three years and has played timpani with The School Band of America European Tour, a Washington University Band Tour, and won his high school's Band Award also. He is the drummer of this year's ISU Jazz Ensemble. Last year, he played an extended engagement in Tallahassee with the popular "Henry and the Family," where he was featured as "a pubescent Gene Krupa."
