ILLINOIS STATE UNIVERSITY

The University was founded in 1857 as the first state institution of higher education in Illinois. It is located in Bloomington-Normal, which is near the geographical center of the state. It is interesting to note that the attorney who prepared the documents establishing the university was Abraham Lincoln. The current enrollment of over 18,000 students represents almost all states of the Union, as well as other nations. A faculty of more than 1,100 makes up the teaching staff for 28 academic departments.

The Music Department offers five undergraduate degrees: Bachelor of Music Education; Bachelor of Music; Bachelor of Arts; Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Science in Education. Through the diversity of these degrees, the department is able to provide the university and the larger national community with the widest range of musical experiences.

The Band Program at Illinois State University encompasses a 104-piece Marching Band, a 150-piece Pep Band, three concert bands and two stage bands. Participation is open to any regularly enrolled student, regardless of his major field of study. The entire program is designed to provide an opportunity for every student to continue his band experience past the high school level.

The Concert Band is the major concert unit of the three concert bands. Qualification for membership is established through audition. Though predominantly composed of music education majors, several other university departments are represented.
