Bi Nka Bi (“One should not bite another”) is a Ghanaian Akan Adinkra symbol about Belonging, Justice, Fair play, Freedom, Peace, Forgiveness, Unity, Harmony, and avoidance of conflict or strife.

My Bi Nka Bi Workshops are grounded in several Ancestral teachings of the Akan of Ghana: Wisdom, Respect, Love, Humility, Bravery, Truth, Honesty, Interdependence, and Community, use proverbs, music, movement, games, play, storytelling, and other indigenous teachings to help build sustainable communities and seek the common good for all.
